BRICE PRAIRIE CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION WOOD DUCK AND HOODED MERGANSER REPORT 2006 AND 2007 TWENTY YEARS OF HELPING OUR LOCAL WATERFOWL

The past two years have seen a transition for the Brice Prairie Conservation Association's Wood Duck Project. This project is now being coordinated by Marc Schultz and John Wetzel and there has been turn over in the members who are checking wood duck boxes. The analysis of the data has also been changed to some degree. In addition we are in the process of compiling a complete record by number and GPS location of the Club's boxes that are on the landscape.

One important data change is how we have reported the number of houses available for use during a particular year. For 2006 and 2007 this number represents the number of houses that were actually checked and reported on. In past reports this number represented the total number of houses that had been put out that year or in prior years. The 2005 Report indicates that about 700 houses have been put out over time but some of these houses have been lost, replaced or are no longer being checked on a yearly basis (Table 4). This change will let us calculate how many checked houses are actually being used each year and let each checker see how their use rate compares to others as well as an overall average. We would like to see individual use percentages equal 50% or more and the Club's average increase to about 60%. To achieve this rate, boxes that have not been used for three years should be moved to more favorable locations.

In 2006, 47% of the available boxes were used (2006 - Table 1), while only 39% were used in 2007 (2007 - Table 1). Individual percentages ranged from 22 - 72% in 2006 and 14 - 68% in 2007. If our use percentages can be raised, we can also increase our real goal for this project – **the production of ducklings!**

Production for 2006 and 2007 was significantly lower than any year since the mid-1990s. This is a result of the drop in the total number of boxes that were checked for these two years. Even with the reduced number of checked boxes, our duckling production reached 1,125 in 2006 and 1,473 in 2007 (Table 4). As has been the case since 1996, hooded merganser production again exceeded wood duck production in 2006 and 2007 (Tables 2, 3 and 4). If we can get our box use percentage up and a few more houses checked, we'll be able to once again push our production totals over the 2,000 mark in the next few years.

We also need to celebrate the accomplishments that have been achieved over the past 20 years. Beginning with 60 boxes and one successful box that produced 10 wood ducks in 1988 (Table 4), we have hatched over 23,000 ducklings including 8,800 wood ducks and 14,500 hooded mergansers – **a very significant accomplishment!**
